Dear Friends and Ministry Partners, **Our family made it safely back to the US on June 13 for a 10-week home assignment.** We're doing well by God's grace as we've been spending quality time with family and friends, enjoying wonderful engagements with our supporting churches and partners, and resting in God's grace. We give thanks to him for his goodness to us! Please pray with us for continued meaningful connections and conversations in the coming weeks!

We also have a prayer need to share with you. With deep sorrow, we want to inform you of a tragedy that shook the education system and many families in the Central African Republic just a week ago. In fact, while the national standardised exams for High School Diploma (baccalauréat) were taking place at the Barthélémy Boganda High School in Bangui, a technical error led to the explosion of the local electric power transformer. The impact of the explosion created panic and total confusion. Not knowing what was happening, students and test supervisors ran "en masse" in all directions for safety. There were even students who jumped from the top floor. The toll of the tragedy was 29 dead and about 260 injured.

You may recall, however, that we recently held a historic conference on Christian education with 850 participants in Bangui. The compelling question of the preparation of the future generation for life and transformation was at the center of our reflections and prayers. As the floodgate of heaven opens up with favor, anointing, and hope in the Lord for the land, this tragic event is an indicator that the enemy is not at all pleased! But we would like to reiterate with firm conviction that we will not allow ourselves to be intimidated or distracted by anyone. The Sovereign Master of the Universe, our God, reigns and He will be glorified forever:

"The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." - John 10:10.

There is hope for the future generation and for Africa! The ongoing Christian education movement in Central Africa and elsewhere in Africa is therefore irreversible. Let us then continue to move forward for the holistic transformation of our nations and continent through Christ-centered education.

Please join us in presenting our condolences to the local association of Christian schools, to the families of the victims of this tragedy,. **Let us pray** for God's consolation, comfort and hope for the youth of the Central African Republic. Peace in Christ, Sosthene and Kara
